

Investigation on Rene Schell How did he inspire me and why?

Rene Schell is 25 years old artist from Coblenz, Germany. He's always been involved and interested in art in many different forms. He's been an artist for so long, even in school every time he gets a chance he doodles on his desk.

Rene Schell is a musician, skateboarder, and a member of the volunteer fire department.

In 2009, he saw spray paint video which made him interested in trying it so he got stoked and began by trying to create space painting using the materials shown in the videos, then he started to try more difficult techniques of landscape and mountain scenes.

I got inspired by what he said "Then I started branching out and trying the more difficult techniques of landscape & mountain scenes", he inspired me to challenge myself and try new things so that I get more professional.

I also got inspired by this artwork, which is called "Moon and earth". I like this artwork because of the way the earth is spray painted and the outlines in earth and moon caught my attention, which when I look at makes me happy and relaxed.

What is my idea for my practice work? Why did I choose this idea? How can express my feelings?



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My idea is to draw different sizes of the moons and the biggest plant would have some Dubai's buildings and Vurj's, since I love Dubai and my mother's family there so I enjoy my time there. The buildings would be in blue color with some highlights so that it can pop out, the sky will be in blue and black colors with some white as stars.

I choose this idea to express my feelings in the artwork, so the buildings would show that I like Dubai and how it looks like and I think the blue color would show my feelings of relaxation. The moon would be in gray with shades and highlights of dark gray and black; with a white outline that would show it more natural.

My experimental in my practice work:



In my painting, I'll be adding a movement, texture on the waves which show the smoothness and the direction of the water.

The shape of the waves is a circle so while using the brush to make the wave I'll draw curved lines that are bold and slim to show the smoothness of the water.



Adding animals would make the painting more realistic and lively.





Investigation on spray painting techniques:

As my first time doing spray paint I've learned new techniques and gained new skills in how to use spray paint and what supplies it needs, while practicing I had to use many papers since I was learning the techniques till I got how to do it correctly which by then it was easy to do it accurately and fast.

One of the techniques I applied as a beginner was pressing down on the top with the can which has to be away from the surface, aimed at one side, then in one fluid motion by using my entire arm to move the can, also using a spray paint that is room temperature and it has to be shaken a little before using it to mix the paint thoroughly and I have to be sure to shake the can occasionally while painting too. To prevent the paint from dying inside, first I have to turn the can upside down and press the tip until the spray becomes clear.

To get a thin line I have to get close to the surface, but I need to move the can to a sloping position, to get a thinner line I had to point to the upper side toward the direction I'm painting on, for example, to draw a vertical line I have to hold the can vertically and to draw a horizontal line the can has to be horizontal.

Another technique was for multiple passes, it was better to do several light coats than a heavy coat plus it would allow the paint to dry fast that way and it depends on the rate of dry in a can, also the technique in showing a volume or a pattern nor design was that first I squeeze the magazine and put it on the spray paint then press down on it and take the magazine.

What strategies did I use?

As for the background, I'm planning on doing moons and planets which it has the technique for using circle stencils to make it like how I did on my practice painting.

In making the beach I had to use perspective way to make it more realistic and to show the waves I have to use a pallet knife, paper, and a white spray paint.

I had to draw trees and cut it as stencils to spray paint it, both trees are overlapping and to show the trees I had to use a pallet knife and a gold spray paint to make to show the structure/shadow of the tree so that it pops out

Techniques made in my first studio work "Ocean way ":

By drawing stroke lines in front of the waves, it would show the movement of the wave and the direction it's going, to make the waves more realistic I've added splashes by using a technique where I get a big brush and use titanium white Acrylic mixed with water then start making the splashes.

I've drawn the camel in the sand, I painted the camel in black so that is can much the other objects plus the sand was painted in black and burnt umber (Acrylic) which I blended with each other to show that this texture is rough and sandy.





Investigation of composition rules 'the rule of thirds' and 'the rule of odds'

Examples of The Rule of Thirds:

Composition rules are the starting point for deciding on the composition of the painting to decide where will the objects be placed, one of the rules is called "THE Rule of Third", which is a basic rule that is commonly used by photographers and painters.

The Rule of Third is where the picture can't be split in half, either vertically or horizontally where the main focus of the picture would be about one-third cross or up or down or where the lines intersect, this rule wil let the viewer see the main object then the things surrounding the object.

The other Composition Rule is called "The Rule of Odds", is a rule where a painter decides to have a painting on odd numbers of items or objects in a painting like three, five, or seven, rather than an even number like two, four, or six.

A painting with odd numbers attracts the viewer since the eye and the brain can't pair them up or group them easily which keep the eye of the viewer moving acrosshe composition, why? Because with odd numbers of object, there will be more dynamic in terms of composition.

My idea for my second studio work

How will the composition of the painting be and why?

I want to show my love to my family in Dubai so since they live in Dubai I would draw the city of Dubai by showing buildings and Burj's, I've decided to have the earth and the plants in different corners of the painting which will be a good composition showing the role of third where the main object is one-third of the painting either across or up or down or where the lines intersect. On the top of the earth, I will draw the buildings of Dubai and a hand hugging the earth since I want to show my feeling toward my family that I like them and miss being surrounded by them. I've decided to include space since it represents relaxation that I feel when I'm in Dubai.

What media will I use?

This is my first time doing oil paint in a professional way, I've done oil paint before but it had many errors in it which I have realized it now, one of the errors were showing the object's texture and the right colors to choose, my last portrait I've done was photography of a woman that has paint on her face, since the paint on the woman's face where pink, orange, green, yellow, and some black I've decided to paint the hair in light gray which then I didn't show hairy structure. From my last painting I wanted to develop my skills in oil paint to show my objects material/texture.

My own perception of my studio work "Dubai being Missed"

My perception of this artwork is to view how Dubai buildings and burjs' would look like on earth, to create a three-dimensional feeling where I can show that the main focus is on the buildings and Burjs'.

Investigation on Rene Schell and why he inspired me?

I was inspired by Rene Schell who's originally from Germany. He was always interested in art and has been an artist ever since he was a child; since he used to doodle at his dest in school. In 2009, he started spray painting and tried different techniques of landscapes and mountain scenes.

I was inspired by his artworks espaically the one on the right and it's called "", his painting had many meanings behind it so I decided to take the idea of painting planets and changing it to my own style to show how I feel in my painting.

Process of my art work "Dubai being missed":



This is my first time doing a hand where I Showed the skin tone of the hand in a natural way by blinding light and dark colors together to show the shades of the hand by using flesh tint, yellow ocher, burnt umber, burnt sienna, and titanium white.

I would like to improve the look of the hand by showing more details like to include the veins in the hand and showing the bones (small details) when I gain the skills I need to do it, also I would like to show more of the movement of hugging in the hand while hugging the planet.

This is Atlantic hotel; it was hard for me to add the small details. I didn't like the top part of the building since I didn't imagine it like this; I wanted it to be in a 3D way and showing the thickness and how strong the material of the building because now it looks kind of weird and not that structured, so next time I'll make sure I have done this since I like doing every part of an object in a detailed way.



Reviewing and refineing my "Dubai being missed":





I included the Galaxy with different shades of blue and purple including black to give the feeling of relaxation and calmness which I enjoyed doing, I really like how the Galaxy looks and I'm proud since this is my first time making the Galaxy, also I want to mention that I used my fingers to do the Galaxy (finger painting).



Painting the moon was kind of tough because I needed to show the perspective of the light coming from a corner, but I didn't know how to do it correctly, also I should've made the half of the outline of the moon in white to show the circular shape of the moon.

What technique I used \ \tag{for the background?}

Why did I use this color?

The technique I used was starting with a dark color which was purple mixed with some black and blue, and then the next layer was in violet, the last layer which is surrounded by the building and the planets are in pure white mixed with a little of purple, so it can engage with the different values of purple the space which also shows that the plant is the main focus in the painting.

Near the planet is a light value that shows that I feel comfortable and happy surrounded by my family, and a dark value away from the planet that shows how sad and depressed I feel toward my family if I were away from them.

I choose the color purple since it gives the feeling of royalty, nobility, and prestige. This also symbolizes mystery and luxury.

What will I do to

improve my
background?

I'll repaint the background from violent color into more purple, bluish color to make it more realistic, then I'll make the moon look more realistic where in the bottom corner I'll paint it in gray mixed with pure white and on the top in dark gray with some black to show the circular texture of the moon. While the other small planet will be in a lemon yellow color, in order to make it as a 3D dimension I'll add a brownish black color in the top right corner where it will be lighter on the bottom of the planet to make it also 3D dimension. In making these two planets a 3D dimension to show that it's at the back of the planet and in this I used a force perception technique since I changed the sides of the two planets in a smaller circles compared to the earth planet and painted them with dark colors in the corner to make it a 3D texture to make people understand and see that they're at the back.



Investigation about Thomas's photography 'Urban

Offering':

The 'Urban Offering' artwork is about city life and everything it has to offer. Thomas Barbey loves the urban lifestyle, fine restaurants, and the theater, tall building, etc. The hands in the image are digging into the ground to pick up the city for you to sample.

This artwork's media is a canvas print, a canvas print is an image printed onto a canvas which is stretched or gallery-wrapped, onto a frame and displayed.

I was inspired by Thomas Barbey because of how he Photoshops his photos in a way that shows his idea in a unique way. Since I liked his style I wanted to try it in one of the photos I took of Burj Khalifa that is considered the tallest building in the world and famous building in Dubai that shows Dubai's development.


My idea for my next studio work "The pride Within":


One of my practice paintings:

Hot glue gun

Heat tool or a hair dryer (to heat the crayons) **Step 1:** Decide the color you're using.

Step 2: Take off the wrappers off all the crayons you're planning to use (you can use a utility knife to take it off fast).

Step 3: Stick the crayons on the edges as you like (using hot glue).

Step 4: Make sure the thing you're doing the melting crayon on must be raised up at a gentle angle.

Step 5: Turn on the heat tool or a hair dryer to melt the crayon.


My idea for practice work:

I wanted to transfer the image on wood using acetone but I changed my idea since I tried many ways of transferring imagine (with color) on wood and it failed.

My new idea is to do transfer image, but the image will be colorless where it shows how there are sad and depressing things that happened to me and things that went wrong that I didn't expect and to push the bad stuff away I have to look at the world on the other side which I did.

This made me live my life feeling that there are people by my side and that there is still hope to make my life better, so the glasses that I'm going to draw will be by oil paint and inside the glasses it'll show how I see my life which will be painted in colors to make it colorful to show that my life is full of joy and happiness.

Reviewing and refining:

There were many failures with my first idea which was transferring a colorful image on wood. I tried it on wood with acetone by putting pressure on the paper by the spoon to make the image transfer, however it didn't really give good result.

The second attempt was putting the picture on a glossary paper and ironing it, it had better results than the first attempt, but the problem was that the image was stuck on the glossary paper but it had the colors of the image, however it didn't work so I had decided to transfer the image in black and white where I could Photoshop the image to make it colorless, so it worked and it brought better results but some parts weren't clear.


I started tracing over the image with charcoal pencil to make it pop up by adding the dark values. This is my first time trying charcoal, but it was easy and fast, especially when I did the wood part which I'm proud about since I made it look natural and I'm showing the texture however it needs some shades and some dark values.

Reviewing and refine:ing

I didn't know how to draw the glasses from when I did the transfer image the image turned out darker that I thought it would and it was hard to see to draw glasses. So, I thought of tracing the outer layer of the sunglasses and tapping the paper on the sides of the wood to trace the glasses, but I said maybe it would not work so I came up with an idea to stick a real glass on the wood by the really hard glue and to paint the image inside the glasses with colors. After thinking a lot I thought of a better idea where I stick a plastic stick on top with a transparent colorless string to hold glasses and there will be a distance between the glasses and the wood so that when the viewer sees the art piece from the classes which make it unique.

It was hard for me to do my idea so I didn't include the glasses in my art piece instead I'll stick the word 'happiness' and 'Meraki'. This is a Greek term that means doing something with total love, and pure soul. The reason why I choose this word was because it meant doing things with love and by this you'll make yourself happy and others too, which will make peace and unity.




My pictures





I'm proud of how the stairs looks I've painted the stairs while looking at the small details to make it realistic which it did, I've added the dark and light values in the right places to show the perception of it. I just need to fix the wood on the sides only.

On the other hand it was hard for me to do the rock, I was stuck on it because it's my first time painting a rock so, I think I can do better than this in making it more natural and in showing the roughness of the rock because I'm not satisfied of how the rock looks now.



Painting the trees was difficult for me since I don't have an idea how to do it, but it turned out better than I expected, however, I need to make the details on the tree by showing the softness of the leaves and I have to make it more greenish, also I need to show the roughness of the trunk in adding some thick and dark streaks.

I noticed that there is empty space on the sides so I wanted to look for a unique idea to cover the space with a creative idea, so I came up with melting crayons on the edges and with this technique I can give the artwork a creative touch and since I wanted to try it, I got the confidence to do it however, it didn't turn out as I expected, there were a lot of empty space and it was messy. I decided to fill the empty spaces with Gold spray paint and I like how it looks now.







Investigation on Thomas Barnbey life and how he started doing art:




Thomas Barbey grew up in Geneva, Switzerland. Where across the street there was the largest manufacturer of art supplies called" Caran D'ache". At the age of 13, he started drawing using black and gouaches for color. After he lived in Geneva for 17 years and designing posters for musical bands, he decided to move to Italy, where he lived in Milan for 15 years becoming successful as an artist, lyricist, and a fashion photographer.

Thomas was a photographer for over twenty years and he uses his old canon (camera). He has his own style in photography, where he combines several images to create a surreal situations with the help of the enlarger in a dark room, also he only uses black and white, sometimes Sepia toning to make his work unique and very characteristic..

How did Thomas Barbey inspire me? I got inspired by Thomas Barbey to make a unique style and one of his photographs inspired me a lot, which is called "Burb to Urb". This photograph is the one in the background of this page.

I wanted to do similar to this idea but with using oil paint and include Dubai city.

Communication of my idea for my next studio work:



I decided to draw a 3D painting that includes buildings of Dubai, sea, and boats in a bowl with drops falling from the sky to the bowl. In each drop will be parts of a city (in each drop one thing) and the drops will form a full city inside the bowl. This shows that every success has parts in it and steps.

Technique:

In the process of making a sea, I used lots of colors like Burnt Sienna, Ivory Black, Prussian blue, Burnt Umber, Phthalo Blue, white, and some shades of green.

In order to make the sea look realistic, I added those colors (I mentioned in the previous paragraph) as waved thin strokes to show the movement of the sea at the front and to show it in a realistic way, I made those strokes suddenly disappear, the more the sea is father the more it becomes blue.



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

It was difficult however; it was a good result since it's my first time doing clouds.




Galen Rowell was born in Oakland in 1940 and raised in Berkeley, California, to a college professor and a concert cellist. Galen was introduced to the wilderness when he was young, where he began climbing mountains at the age of ten on Sierra Club outings.

Taking photographs was a way for Galen to share his wild world with his friends and family through photos. In 1972 he became a full time photographer after selling his small automotive business. He became more successful

after doing his first major magazine assignment cover story for National Geographic.

It was said by Tom Brokaw that "Galen Rowell was a man who went into the mountains, into the desert, to the edge of the sea, to the last great wild places in the world to be absorbed by their grace and grandeur. That is what he did for himself. For the rest of us, he shared his vision with—click—the release of a shutter, creating photographs as timeless, as stunning, and as powerful as nature itself."

This shows that Galen takes pictures of what he enjoys looking at and wants to share it to the people surrounding him.

Investigation on the color wheel:

Introduction to Color Theory:
Colours can set a mood, attract attention, and make a statement. By selecting the right color schem tranquility can be created. Colors can be the most powerful design element if it was used effectively Colors can affect people in many ways, both mentally and physically. A strong red color has been spreasure or show a dangerous thing where the blue color has a calming effect which means all colors.

The color wheel

The color wheel (color circle) is for combining colors which were first designed by Sir Isaac Newton in 1666. The color wheel is designed so that any vertical colors is picked can look good together.

Traditionally, many color combinations considers especially pleasing which is called color harmonies or color chords; they consist of two or more colors with a fixed relation on the color wheel.

Color Impact is designed to dynamically (giving an effect of movement, vitality, or energy) create a color wheel to match your base color

> Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Colors Primary colors are red, yellow, blue where these colors can't be created in other colors. Secondary colors are green, orange, and purple which is created by mixing two colors from the

primary colors.

The tertiary colors are created by mixing a color from the primary color and another color from the secondary color.

Tints Shades and Tones

- Tint is made when a color is made lighter by adding pure white
- -Shade is made when a black color is added to a color to make a darker version
- -The tone is made when a gray color is added to a color which gives different tones



Warm and cool colors The color wheel can be divided into warm and cool colors

Warm colors attract attention and tend to show strangeness, energetic. Where on the other hand cool colors give an impression of calm, and create a soothing impression (reduces pain).

Color Schemes

Primary

Complementary color scheme:

Colors that are opposite each other on the color wheel is called complementary colors, an example of it is red and green.

To create vibrant looks uses the high contrast of complementary colors, especially when used for full saturation.

The Complementary colors scheme can be tricky to use in large doses, but it works well in making something stand out.

Analogous color scheme

This scheme uses colors that are next to each other on the color wheel, usually they match well and create serene (calm, peaceful) and comfortable designs. This scheme can be found in nature and is tuneful and pleasing to the eyes.

Note that when choosing an analogous color scheme, there has to be enough contrast like choosing one color to dominate, another color to support, and a color that can get along with black, white, or gray as an accent (a detail, brush stroke).





Split-Complementary color scheme

This scheme is a variation of the complementary color scheme. Instead of the base color, it uses the two colors that are next to its complement. This scheme has a strong visual contrast to the complementary color scheme, however the solit complementary color scheme has less tension



Rectangle (tetradic) color scheme:

This scheme uses four colors that are arranged or organized into two complementary pairs, this scheme present many of possibilities for variation which works best if there were a dominant color and a balance between warm and cool colors.

Triadic color scheme

This scheme uses colors that are evenly spaced around the color wheel; they tend to be quite vibrant even if hues were used in pale or unsaturated versions. To use triadic harmony in the right way there should be a color balance where one color dominates and the other two accents.

Skills & techniques in oil paint:



For the land: the first layer was a thin layer of green, and in order to make it realistic I've added dark green, yellow ochre, burnt sienna on the sides to show the roughness of the lands (ground), also I've added some lemon yellow in some parts to make it look more natural.


For the water: the first layer was in blue, then I started adding different shades of blue, purple, and black to show The circular shape of the globe in a 3D way.

My idea for my next artwork "Torn with hectic

Seeing people suffer in a war and you can't do something hurts a lot. Iyad Sabbah who's originally a Palestinian artist, who made a sculpture capturing Palestinians escape to survive, inspired me. To show how people feel I decided to add that dramatic affect to show how people suffer by including a storm and willing clouds with a broken buildings.

Process:

For this building, I've used white, lemon yellow, yellow medium, yellow ochre, burnt sienna, burnt umber; to show the roughness and thickness of the building by adding darker values to make it look 3D.







Investigation of color psychology

What is Color Psychology?

Color psychology is based on the emotional and mental effects, colors have in people's life. Keep in mind, that there will also be variations in interpretation, meaning, and perception between different cultures

Applying Color Psychology to Everyday Life

Sometimes the surroundings can affect people's emotions and state of mind, where people start to notice that there are some places which makes them irritated or relaxed and calm, do you ask why? Well, colors play apart in many places.

In art therapy, color is connected to people's emotions where color can influence people mentally and physically. An example is that a study shows that some people looking at the color red can cause an increase in heart rate and blood pressure.

COLORS AS EMOTION:

Knowledge of color theory helps us to express our feelings in an artwork. The language of color helps artists describe their emotions and their message or point in the artwork.

Blue is the color of trust and peace, it shows loyalty and honesty, from the negative color it shows sadness, depression, and rigid.

Purple is the color of imagination, spirituality, ambitious and self-assured, also impractical.

> **Pink** is the color of love, nurturing, romantic, and sweetness, but also represents the lack of self-worth, showing immature and silliness.

What did she do after graduation? How did start doing her own art?


My drawing
Hong Yi also known as 'Red', which is her nickname in art, she's an
artist who's known for using uncommon materials to create a unique
piece of art.

After Red graduated with a Master in Architecture from the University of Melbourne, she moved to Shanghai for a career in architecture. She loved the chaotic city because of its charm, so once she got to her father and grandparents house, she got inspired by the surroundings and the range of cheap materials that is available in the markets, which by then Red completed her first uncommon work where she made a portrait of a modern Chinese artist named Ai Weiwei, which this portrait was made out of sunflower seeds. And another artwork like Adele portrait made of 1500 melted tea lights, Aung Sun Suu Kyu with dyed carnations, a hanging structure of Jackie Chan made from chopsticks. The use of the uncommon material in her own artworks can attract and inspire people all around the world.

What did Red achieve? And what has inspired her?

Red has been the top in publications including the Wall Street Journal, Time, fast Company and Huffington Post. She has been talking about creativity and innovation in many international conferences all around the

world



Red got inspired by the human diversity and the variation of the human experience, and she hopes that her work will continue to spread all over the world so that people from different cultures learn and know what type of art Red creates.

Secrets artwork:

Red made this artwork since she was inspired by the opening and closing lines of a song called 'Secretes' by Jay Chou. Where in the opening line was about a coffee cup from a saucer, and the closing part was about autumn leaves and fragmented pieces. Red decided to use hundreds of individual coffee stain rings, many of them broken and imperfect like fallen autumn leaves to create a portrait of Jay Chou.

The singer tells a story of heartache, about a woman who travelled through time from 1979 and met the singer in 1999. They fell in love, after that she goes back to 1979 and sketches a portrait of Jay. Where her painting meant to look like a sepia-toned old photography, to capture the soul and the nature of his story

This project took about 12 hours to finish it since coffee was a quite challenging medium to use for Red, with too little water and rings that wouldn't for easily, since too little water and rings blend into each other that results of an unformed pool of coffee. Red had to wait for the light parts to dry before she starts doing the darker parts because the rings would not be visible.





I got inspired by these two art works:

Adele made of melted candles artwork:

Red was inspired by Adele song 'Set Fire to the Rain', which is about the pain of a lost relationship, where rain represents the tears when she cried, and setting them on fire is a way to burn and destroy her pain.

In Adele portrait, Red mentioned that the reason why she used blue candles was because she wanted to represent tears, and by setting fire to them, they start to melt and flow to each other to create the art piece. This project took about two weeks for Red to plan out, and she spends a week to look for the right materials and another week to figure out how she can use the hot candles as a wax in her project. Red used about 1500 candles and it took her to finish the art piece 7 hours.

How did she inspire me? And what is the Idea I'm planning to do?

got inspired by Hong Yi and the unique things she create, so I really like to create something new by using uncommon materials which would show how creative I am and to show people how my artwork are different from others. My idea is to draw a portrait of a girl that has an expression of happiness, where she's happy because her friends and family surprised her with cake and gifts to celebrate her birthday. I'm planning to do the background with party poppers, where I'll stick each piece on the canvas.

Investigation of oil paint techniques:

- ✓ In oil paint, while painting to cover other paint layers you have to make sure the paint is dried first. If you plan to use multiple layers, first start with thinner layers of paint in lighter colors. Slowly make your way toward thicker layers and darker colors.
- ✓ Contrast the colors in your artwork to create a three-dimensional feeling.
- ✓ In monochromatic subject (The object that contains one color) you can add volume and relief by emphasizing the white tones and to do this you must apply white paint thickly over the base colors, but make sure to not over-brush the white paint so that the brush marks and shades can easily see.
- Chiaroscuro is an old technique in oil paint, where it brings volume to an object and focuses on the movement of light across the surface of the object by using light and dark contrasting. While using this technique you have to make sure to make the shadows completely black and it is the best to use a neutral background color.
- ✓ While using charcoal lines behind an object, it will show the shape of an object and it'll give it a dimension.
- Adding textural effect in a painting by leaving streaks of colors in the painting mixture. This way would make the painting is more interesting.

Oil painting supplies:

- Canvas.
- Easel (You can also lay your canvas flat on a table)
- Gesso/Acrylic Paint (To prep your canvas)
- Palette.
- Oil Paints.
- Different sizes of brushes.
- Palette knife.
- Paint thinner, turpentine, or linseed oil.

It was hard at first since it's my first time doing a portrait and in a 3D illustration. I enjoyed making the scars and mixing many shades of red with black and purple to create the same color as natural blood.

It was hard for me also since I have a fear of seeing blood since I feel dizzy and because of this, I hate seeing scars and other cuts so I did this to overcome this fear.





I made the face and the hand by using plaster of Paris with some water, then I mixed Red, blue, yellow, and white acrylic colors in order to get the right shade of skin tone. In order to make the mask look more realistic I decided to add makeup lashes and a wig so that I can add hair to the face; plus, I decided to make a neck and add a shirt with blood in it so that it can look as one piece.


Investigate on Banksy's life and career?

How did his art catch other people's eyes?

Banksy is known as a street artist who keeps his identity unknown where instead of putting his own name he mostly puts either Robert Banks or Robin Gunningham. Banksy began his graffiti art lifestyle by admiring the works of Blek Le Rat and because of him, his career became graffiti and he started in the early 1990s. Banksy was in a graffiti gang crew called DryBreadZ (DBZ). His work was largely free hand, he used stencils on occasion. In the late 1190s, Banksy started using stencils most of the time which made his work become more widely recognized around Bristol and London.



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Banksy artworks are mostly marked by striking images, where he often combines it with slogans. His work often involves a political theme, contains a critiquing war, capitalism, hypocrisy, and greed. He uses subjects in an artwork like rats, apes, policemen, members of the loyal family, and children. Banksy is not only known for his two-dimensional work, he is also known for his installation artworks. One of Banksy installations is called London Phone Booth which featured a bent and broken British Telecommunications phone booth that looks lonely and unhappy laid on the side and an ax above the phone on the side where it causes a blood pooling underneath it. Other Banksy's pieces that have drawn attention was because of their edgy themes or the boldness of their achievements. Banksy's work on the West Bank Barrier, between Isreal and Palestine had a result of a lot of media attention in 2005.

Banksy is also known for his use of copyrighted materials and the defeat of classic images. An example of this is Banksy's version of Monet's famous series of water lily paintings, adapted by Banksy to include drifting trash and debris

The idea behind all of this:

Stencils are usually hand drawn or printed onto sheets of acetate or card, before being cut out by hand because of the self-contained nature of Banksy's work and his identity, it is unknown what techniques Banksy used to generate the images in his stencils, though it is assumed he uses computers for some images due to the photocopy nature of much of his work. He also includes anything found in the streets like street signs and other objects to convey his message by crafting beautiful street art installations.

Banksy started doing graffiti; he was always too slow and was either ended up caught by the police or he could never finish the art in one sitting. So he decided to use the stencil technique to minimize the time and overlapping of the color to make good artwork.

I was inspired by Banksy since he uses the unused material in his artworks, also I was inspired by how he has the courage in showing his opinion or a problem whether it's in politics or between people without getting scared. So, I decided I wanted to do a 3D artwork that talks about people stabbing other people in the back even though they've been treated well by that person. Which happens a lot of people but these days it happens more than before.

I'm planning on making a human body by using unused clothes and a mask for the face. The idea is that I'll bring a piece of wood that is 170cm tall and the man that I'll create would be standing with one leg lifted on the wood, this man will be covering his face with a hat and will be holding a nife. In order to make it more realistic, I'll paint the wood as wall bricks.

"Everybody has a knife ready to stab you in the back." Many people would agree with this quote since the majority of people faced this kind of action at least once in their lives. I personally see this kind of things happen with people I know which really makes me say "people are still like this?" so, because of this I wanted to make an artwork that directly gives the viewer the idea of that you don't know the person who'll stab you in the back whether this person is close to you or not. However, I want to present this 3D artwork in an eye-catching way and in a unique way since it's talking about reality.



Investigation on how to transfer an image:

Steps to transfer an image:

Step one: lay the photo facedown on the wood surface that the picture will be transferred on so that the photo end up facing the right way when it's revealed on the flip side. (Check that your photo is set at 300 DPI so that it won't print out all pixelated)

Step two: got your reversed, properly sized, 300 DPI photo printed from a laser printer on fairly thin paper. Step three: Cut out the laser printout on your photo.

Step four: cover some of the scrap paper on the surface of your work. Then take one of your brushes and use it to put on a thin layer of matte gel medium right on top of our nhoto

Step nine:

Once your photo transfer is dry and satisfacto ry to your creative eye, use the Mod Podge and your other brush to seal vour hard work.

Step eight: First, put on some good jams. This part needs to take its sweet time. Now that your transfer is soaking wet, use your rag and/or your fingers to rub off the fuzzy white paper fibers and to reveal your lovely photo underneath. (For a distressed look to your transfer, use the wet rag to rub off the paper fibers. The rag's own fibers will also rub off a bit of your photo that's reveal.) (For a less-distressed, cleaner look, use your fancy fingers to rub off the fibers. Let the transfer dry a bit in between paper-rubbing sessions so you can see any paper fibers that still need to be rubbed

Step seven: Once your photo transfer has been out to dry for 8 hours, then give it a good water soaking, but make sure your work surface is covered with some fun towels. Then take your towel rag and get it wet with some water, squeeze out excess water from your rag (you don't want a sopping wet rag) and lay it on top of your photo transfer. Then press the wet rag on top of your photo transfer; making sure the photo in the transfer is completely soaked. You can also just let the wet rag sit on top of the transfer for a couple of minutes if you'd

Step six: let your photo transfer sit and dry for at least 8 hours.

Step five: very carefully lay your photo facedown on top of your wood piece. Once you got your photo in place, use a bone folder (or the edge of a gift card) to smooth out and flatten any air bubbles underneath your photo. Wipe off any extra gel medium that seeps out of your photo's edges as you're smoothing it out.



My idea for my next studio work:

I'm planning on using a photo that I took in a park that has a path in it, so I want to show through this picture that each person choose their own path and face the results of it whether it's happy results or not. This reminded me of my friends since we're graduating and each one of us is taking their own path and continuing their own life in the way they want it.

I combined the pictures in the left and right, and then I added the picture on the left and placed it inside the drop of water. Since Thomas Barbey's style is black and white I decided to make the background in black and white. However, I kept the leaf and the drop (with the picture inside the drop) in color so that it gives a nice effect and shows that this is the focal point that let the viewer understands the idea I want to show in this nhoto.

What I'm planning to do?

I'm planning on editing the picture and doing something like Thomas Barbey since I like his style and his own ways of representing the ideas he wants in an incredible way. However, I'm planning on adding a quote that represents my idea. Which says, "By choosing our path, we choose our destination." I really liked this quote because it's really true.
